

Christine Culpepper McGoogan - Obituary

Christine Culpepper McGoogan passed away on Sunday, July 28, in Brunswick, Ga.

She was married on July 8, 1961, to Joseph T. McGoogan, who survives her. She was born on April 15, 1939, in Brunswick, Ga., to the late Emmett and Bernice Brim Culpepper. She was a graduate of Glynn Academy, class of 1957. She received a degree in education from Georgia State College for Women, class of 1961, where she was active in both the college choir and in student government, holding many offices and serving as president of the College Government Association her senior year. She has been a member of the Presbyterian Church, USA in three different Presbyteries, where she has served in many leadership and teaching capacities.

For nearly 50 years, she lived in Pocomoke City, Md., on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, while her husband was employed by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. They returned to Brunswick in 2007. She was a Plus Volunteer at Peninsula Regional Medical Center in Salisbury, Md., and was involved with numerous school, church, sports and civic activities of her children when the family lived in Maryland.
